Cyberbullying & Misconduct	 Online behaviour must reflect respect, responsibility, and safety. Any form of cyberbullying—harassment, threats, exclusion, harmful posting—is prohibited. Yondr Programme – Phone-Free School	 MIS Secondary School is a phone-free campus. All students must turn off their phones, place them in their assigned Yondr Pouch, and secure the pouch daily upon arrival at school. - Students must bring their Yondr Pouch to school every day and keep it in good working condition.
- Students arriving late or leaving early must pouch/unpouch their phone in the Secondary Office.
- Random bag inspections may occur to ensure compliance.
- If a mobile device is found outside the pouch, it will be confiscated and parents may be required to pick it up.
- Damaged, tampered, or lost pouches may result in additional consequences and replacement fees.
